Lillian Jeter is a former law enforcement commander from the United States who uncovered a case of elder abuse and neglect in 1985 that changed the nation's whole perspective on the mistreatment of vulnerable older persons.

On the 20th February 2006 with her appearance on Lateline with Tony Jones and subsequently through various television, radio, and media, Lillian exposed the plight of vulnerable older persons being abused and mistreated in nursing homes throughout Australia. Lillian is a regular consultant to ABC's Lateline as well as a contributor to other media sources including 7:30 Report, Charles Wooley's Across Australia, all print media sources as well as radio outlets.

For the past 23 years, Lillian has presented keynote addresses, delivered presentations and conducted workshops for professional audiences in aged care, policy, legal, human rights and criminal justice around the world on the abuse, neglect, mistreatment, and exploitation of vulnerable older persons.

Lillian also serves as a consultant in elder abuse cases both nationally and internationally, provides expert witness testimony in civil and criminal cases, and serves as a representative for victims and family members in Civil & Administrative Tribunal cases regarding guardianship and administration throughout Australia.
