what is elder abuse?

Elder abuse can take various forms:

Physical abuse can range from slapping or shoving to severe beatings and inappropriate restraint.

Emotional or psychological abuse can range from name-calling or giving the "silent treatment" to intimidating and threatening the individual. If fear, mental anguish, or emotional pain and distress is caused, the behaviour can be regarded as abusive.

Financial exploitation can range from misuse of an older family member's funds to embezzlement. Financial exploitation can include fraud, forgery or forced property transfers.

Carer neglect can range from withholding appropriate attention to intentionally failing to meet the physical, social, or emotional needs of the older person.

Sexual abuse can range from sexual exhibition to rape.
